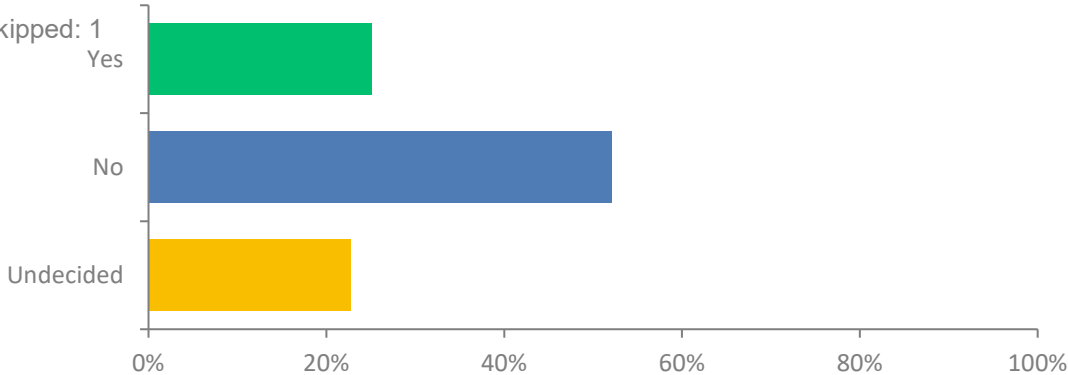

Q2: During new site development in the RCC, should all building materials be required to be new?

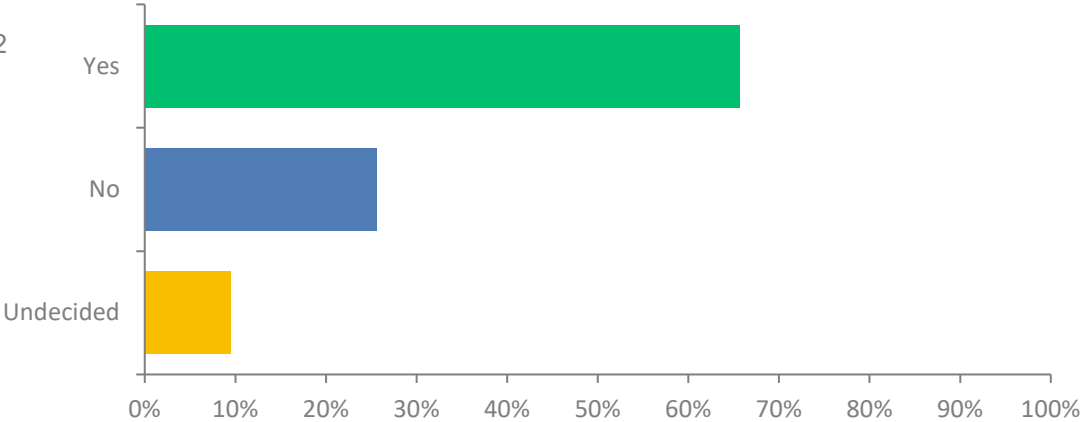

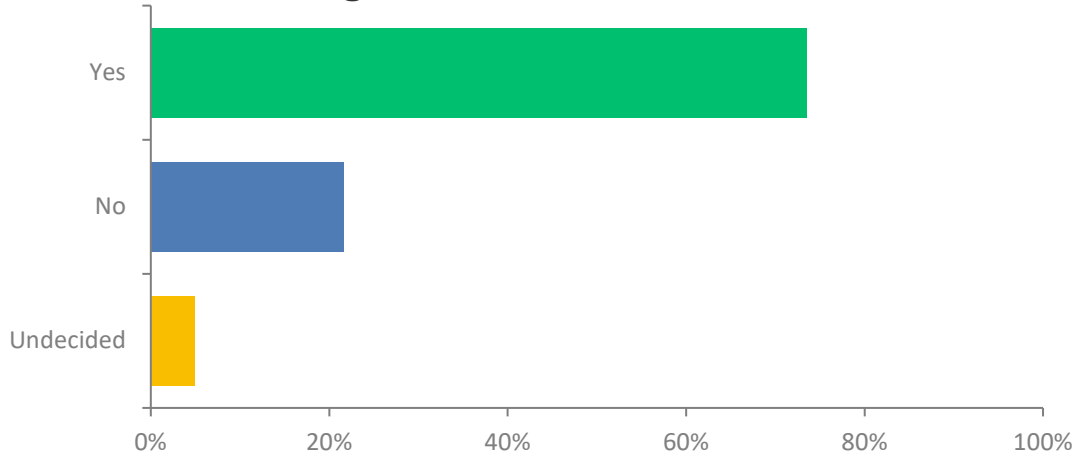

Q4: Currently, there is a 26-foot height limit on “homes” in the RCC." Do you think the word “homes” should be changed to “all structures”?

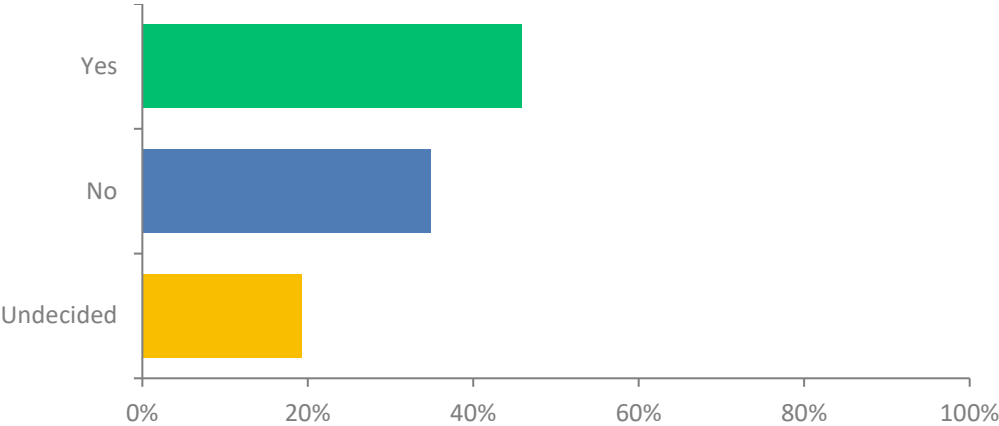

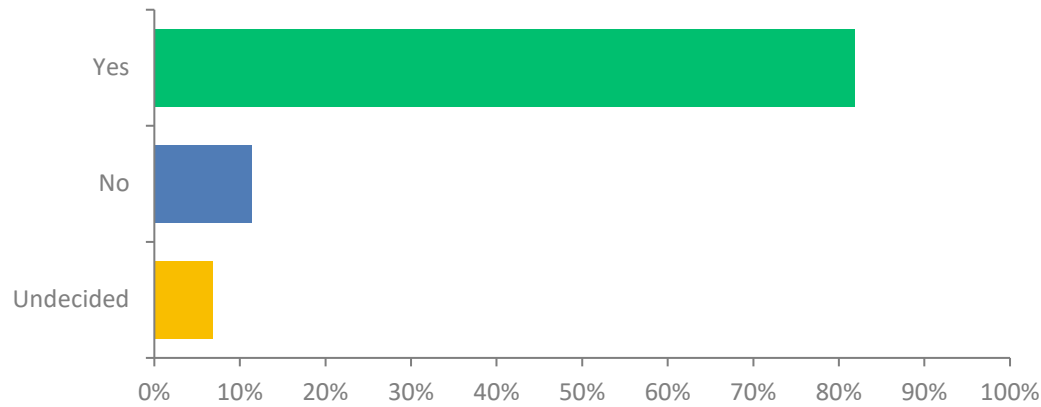
